BBE Grp 1st winners will then compete for **Best Bred by in Show**, and will be judged immediately following Best Puppy in Show, on Saturday July 26th.

The charge for Electricity is \$10/day/outlet.**

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

A foreign born and foreign owned dog will be granted an ERN for the sole purpose of entering CKC events and having titles granted. This may be done prior to entries closing or within 30 days of the dogs first win. The requirements are as follows:

1. A photocopy of the dog's AKC registration certificate reflecting current ownership along with a written request for an Event Registration Number (ERN).
2. Payment of \$53.50 by cheque, money order, or VISA/MasterCard (number and expiry date required)
Your return address must be included with your request.
3. Information & payment are to be forwarded to the Canadian Kennel Club, 100-89 Skyway Ave. Etobicoke, Ontario 6R4.
4. If you are paying by VISA or MasterCard you may fax info to (416) 675-6506.

No **Post Dated cheques** will be accepted. The Shows and Trails Division of the CKC interprets the term "Post Dated" to mean date other than the date on which the entry was received. Entries cannot be processed unless the date of the cheque is current. Entries must be received by, and in the hands of the Show Secretary on the date of closing of entries.

Entries will be returned if the entry has been sent with a post-dated cheque.

A Canadian Kennel Club **Listing Fee** is payable if entry does not include a CKC Individual Registration number. Litter Registrations are not acceptable.

To compete in the Non-Regular classes, the dog must be entered in regular classes or as Exhibition Only.

US EXHIBITORS: We suggest you purchase Bank Drafts or Money Orders. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they must be payable in US funds – for the full amount of the entry. Personally discounted cheques will not be accepted. Please do not mark personal cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as such items are not readily cleared through the banks. Your co-operation is appreciated.

OFFICIAL CKC CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following classes will be divided by sex.

- Junior Puppy: A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show.
Senior Puppy: A dog between 9 months up to 12 months on the day of the show.
12-18 Months: A dog between the ages of 12 months and 18 months on the day of the show.
Canadian Bred: A dog which was born in Canada.

Bred by Exhibitor: A dog owned and handled by the breeder.

- Open Class: All dogs.
Specials Only: Dogs which are Canadian Champions only.
Exhibition Only: Dogs 6 months and over, not in competition.

SPECIALS CLASS: Moving a dog to the Specials Class – A dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and has completed the requirements for Championship, according to Section 20 of the Dog Show Rules, may after closing of entries be transferred from one of the regular classes to the "Specials Only" class. The request for the transfer is to be submitted to the Show Secretary by the owner or handler at least ONE HOUR prior to the opening of the Show. The required form is available from the Show Secretary.

EARTHDOG – Form follows function!

There will be two CKC Earthdog Tests held in conjunction with the FKC Conformation Shows, hosted by Border Terrier Canada. They will take place on Saturday, July 26, and Sunday, July 27, in the back field at Casey's (show site). Classes offered will be Intro to Quarry, Junior Earthdog, Senior Earthdog, and Master Earthdog (for the first time in Eastern Canada!!!).

These Tests are open to Group 4 and Misc. Group Terriers who have their origins as Earthdogs, and to all Dachshunds.

A class dog awarded Best in Show at any All Breed Championship Show will be credited with Five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at a single show. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge **shall not** be included in the calculation for championship points. Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner to be provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

GENERAL INFORMATION

THE PRECINCTS OF THE SHOW WILL BE THE SHOW SITE AND ENTRANCE, WITHIN 30 FEET OF THE RINGS. No photographer, other than the photographer hired by the club, will be allowed to take pictures for personal gain with in the show precincts.

The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the shows and trials. No dogs under the age of six (6) months are allowed within the show precincts.

A ramp may be used to judge Basset Hounds.

Your judging schedule and identification will be mailed as soon as possible after the entry closing date. It will also be posted at www.fredericktonkennelclub.com and <http://atlantic.canuckdogs.com/> Identification of an accepted entry for dogs must be presented at the entrance to the show premises, and only dogs entered in the shows will be permitted to enter the venue.

The Fredericton Kennel Club will use care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to dogs, exhibitors or patrons.

Judging will not be delayed to accommodate an exhibitor or handler who fails to have his/her dog in the ring when required.

"A dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and has completed the requirements of championship in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 20 of these rules, after closing date and time for entries of the show, but whose championship is confirmed by CKC may be transferred from one of the regular classes to "Specials Only" providing the request for transfer is submitted by owner or handler to the Show Secretary, in writing, at least one hour prior to the opening of the show".

Overpayment of entry fees up to a maximum of \$10.00 will be considered a donation to the Fredericton Kennel Club Trophy Fund

Ainslie L. Mills (Oriana Perm. Reg. Golden Retrievers) Surrey, B.C., Canada

My husband, Barrie, and I have owned and loved Golden Retrievers since 1974 and a Black Labrador from 1993-2007. I have actively shown in conformation and obedience in the USA and Canada over the years, with occasional ventures into Tracking and field training. From our limited breeding program, we have bred and/or owned 57 Canadian champions, 7 American champions, 8 Canadian Obedience Trial Champions, 8 GRCC Hall of Fame Outstanding Producers and 4 GRCC Obedience Hall of Fame dogs, Group Winners, Best Puppy in Show Winners, High in Trial winners, Guide Dogs for the Blind, certified Search and Rescue Dogs, Avalanche Rescue Dogs, obedience, tracking and field title holders.

I have been active with both local and national Golden Retriever Clubs. I am a Past-President of the Golden Retriever Club of Canada and Golden Retriever Club of BC, and we are both Life Members of the Canadian Kennel Club, GRCC and GRCBC. I presently chair the Golden Retriever Club of Canada Breed Standard and Judge's Education Committee and the Golden Retriever Club of America's Judges' Education Committee. I have done presentations on my breed in Canada, the USA, Australia and Japan. I was active in the past as both a volunteer and Board member of Canadian Guide Dogs for the Blind (BC Branch).

I have judged conformation since 1992 and I am currently approved by the Canadian Kennel Club to judge the Sporting, Hound, Toy and Herding Groups. I am on permit for the Non-Sporting Group. I have thoroughly enjoyed judging all-breed and specialty shows from coast to coast across Canada and the USA, as well as in Australia and New Zealand.

I have worked for thirty-five years in the Library at my alma mater, Simon Fraser University and enjoy music, choral singing and collecting anything "Golden".

JOHN B. ROSS

John's first purebred dog was a Boxer acquired in 1965. With his wife Lory, they bred their first litter of Miniature Schnauzers in the late 1960's. Several more Mini Schnauzers followed and were shown extensively, with some placing in the top three breed standings. John also became a breeder of German Shorthaired Pointers, campaigning several, and Airedale Terriers, the latest litter arriving in 2007. A very promising female is about to be shown in both Canada and the USA

John was a member of the Canadian Professional Handlers Association, serving on the executive. He became a professional show photographer but in the early 1990's started to judge. Retiring from the photography, John has been concentrating on his judging career, and has judged from coast to coast in Canada and at several shows in the USA.

John is currently licensed to judge Sporting, Working, Terriers and Herding, as well as Best In Show. In the year 2001, he was granted life membership in the Canadian Kennel Club as a 30 year continuous member.

Susan M. Badick

I little personal biography, you say? Long ago and far away ... well long ago anyway!! As a youngster, I was involved with dog shows and retriever field trials. I was the Alberta Kennel Club junior handling champion in 1958 showing a Labrador Retriever. In the late 1960's and early 1970's I did not own a dog myself, but handled many dogs for friends – mostly Hounds, some Terriers and Pembroke Welsh Corgis.

I finally bought a dog of my own in 1976 – my much loved "Twinkle" (Ch. Stargang Mrs. Tiggywinkle), a Miniature Wire-Haired Dachshund which I imported from England. I have bred Miniature Wire-Haired Dachshunds and Whippets under the NASUSA prefix (permanently CKC registered). My first Whippet was "Lexie" (Can.Am.Ch. Nineveh Royal Denby). She was my "Cinderella" dog (kindly given to me on co-ownership by her original owners, Marc & Tanya Fontaine). She went on to win many specialties and is still, in fact, the top specialty-winning bitch in Canadian history long after her death. "Lexie" was my foundation and she appears in every Nasusa Whippet pedigree. My daughter, Carla, has now joined me in the Whippet breeding program. I have also owned two Salukis from Srinagar Kennels in California. I never bred the Salukis as I did not feel that I could find enough good homes for Saluki puppies. My breeding program has always been very limited, breeding only when I wanted something for myself. Since 1976 I have bred and/or owned dogs that have been rated by Dogs in Canada magazine as #1, 2 or 3 in their breeds more than 30 times (always owner-handled). We have also bred and/or owned dogs that have done significantly well at American specialties.

I am approved in Canada to judge all Hounds, all Sporting Dogs, all Working Dogs, all Terriers, all Toy Dogs and all Herding Dogs. I am on permit for the Non-Sporting Group. I have had the honour and privilege to judge many all Hound, all Gazehound, Whippet, Saluki and Dachshund specialties in Canada, the U.S., Australia, New Zealand and Finland. I have also judged specialties for Afghan Hounds, Finnish Spitz, Australian Shepherds, Belgian Shepherd Dogs and Bouviers des Flandres. I judged the first ever all Hound specialty in the U.S. in 1996 and 168 Salukis in Lompoc, CA. in 1997. I have also had the pleasure of judging the Canadian Whippet National Specialty in 2000 and the Canadian Bouvier des Flandres National Specialty in 2005.

Although I am now retired, I previously supported myself and my “dog habit” by working full-time as a cataloguer at the University of Calgary Library for 38 years. At present, I share my home with one Siberian Husky, one Labrador Retriever, one Scottish Terrier and 2 Miniature Wire-Haired Dachshunds. Besides the dogs, my other ‘passion’ is my two children, Mark and Carla, and my two grandsons, Alex and Erik.

Ray Smith first started showing dogs in the early 60's but it was when he switched to his present breed, Standard Smooth Dachshunds, that he really got active in breeding and showing under the Tanaray prefix.
