IMPORTANT NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

- 1. ENTRY LIMIT 100 RUNS (includes Instinct, Novice, Open, Excellent & Master runs Maximum 15 Instinct tests)
- 2. One dog per handler per division
- 3. Posting of testing may not be placed on social media or shared until end of trial
- 4. The only dog permitted in trial area is dog being tested; No dogs allowed with spectators.
- 5. All dogs must be under control on a leash except during the test if permitted by the judge.
- 6. No prong collars

No entry will be accepted that is incomplete or that is submitted without full entry fees. Exhibitors must abide by any errors made in entering their dog(s) regardless of how or by whom the entries were made. The HKC reserves the right to refuse an entry, subject to CKC rules.

All entry fees must be in the hands of the Trial Secretary prior to closing date.

Judging Schedules and Armband Numbers will be sent out after the closing date

Personal Cheques and money orders for full value only will be accepted and must be made payable to the Halifax kennel Club. No post-dated cheques accepted. All NSF cheques and declined credit cards will be subject to a charge of \$40.00. NSF cheques are considered non-payment of entry fees.

All entries paid by credit card MUST be sent via DogShow.ca. No other entry service is authorized to accept entries for these events.



A service charge of 10% will be assessed. This includes entries sent online or post using a credit card or interac for payment.

If you were unable to enter these trials due to the limit being reached, you may contact the Trial Secretary and request to be placed on the Waitlist.

<u>Attention Foreign Exhibitors</u>: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we suggest that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds to the "Halifax Kennel Club". Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

Eligibility

To compete in these trails, a dog must be at least 6 months of age and registered with the CKC and have a registration number, or an ERN, TCN, PEN, CCN or Misc. certificate number, or be eligible for the same. Dogs may not be lame.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete. When a bitch comes into season after entry has been submitted to the Trial Secretary, a refund of the entry fee will be made as long as a Veterinarian's certificate, certifying the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial, reaches the Trial Secretary on or before the start of the trial.

No dog may be brought within the trial precincts if it is known to have a communicable disease or has recovered from a communicable disease within the last 30 (thirty) days prior to the event or has been housed within 30 (thirty) days with other dogs with a communicable disease. Entries may be refunded for dogs/bitches that pose a threat of communicable diseases on the day of the trial provided a letter from a veterinarian stating such is presented to the Trial Secretary prior to the commencement of the trial.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - Effective January 1, 2023

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). Listed Breeds that do not yet have a Miscellaneous Class Number (MCN) will be eligible to apply for a TCN.

Temporary Competition (TC) fees of \$11.50 per trial are payable with the Entry Fee for dogs that do not have their individual registration number or ERN at the closing date. There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

A TCN may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number. If your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores or awards, before applying for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if the CKC has already created a TCN for that dog. There will be a tab called TCN Dogs in the owner's Portal account.

NON-PUREBRED DOGS REQUIRE A CCN TO COMPLETE THEIR ENTRY:

These trials are open to non-purebred dogs. If entering your non-purebred dog (includes mixed-breed and unrecognized-breed) in these trials, your dog will be required to have a Canine Companion Number to complete the entry form. Please check the CKC Policy and Procedures Manual Chapter 6.34 (found on-line at the CKC website <u>http://www.ckc.ca/en/Events/Overview-of-Events/Agility</u>) for requirements to obtain your dog's CCN. Event Registration Number (ERN):

All dogs that are foreign born and owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an ERN. **Effective January 1, 2023** the policy has been changed to allow Listed Breeds

registered with a different Canadian registry to also apply for an ERN. Canadian born dogs that are registerable by a breed association in Canada recognized by Agriculture Canada may obtain an ERN. An ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event to avoid cancellation of any awards, scores or wins. Dogs may be entered as LISTED. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a 30 day extension to CKC. An ERN may be obtained by contacting the CKC by phone at (416) 675-5511 or by fax (416) 675-6506.

Non-Member Participation Fee (Canadian residents):

A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a "non-member of the Canadian Kennel Club. The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to Canadian Kennel Club members. Rosettes

Rosettes will be awarded for each Qualifying Score per component at all levels. A HKC New Title Rosette will be awarded to all dogs earning a Novice, Open, Excellent or Master title as well as any dog earning a Container, Interior or Exterior title.

Trial and General Information:

- 1. The Trial Superintendent will be in full charge of the events that will be governed by CKC rules.
- Revised as per CKC. Provided the dog has completed the requirements for the level of competition, Move ups are available to the next level of competition at the next trial if made at least 15 minutes before the start of the class by completing the required Move-up Form.
- 3. Day of Entry permitted if limit has not been reached for that day (Fee is \$30.00). This must be completed 1 hour before the trial starts.
- 4. Participants in the trials will be required to volunteer. A volunteer sign up sheet will be sent out once entries close.
- 5. **Trial Precincts:** The buildings being used for the trials and any area(s) that are marked off for exterior components.
- 6. Be prepared to crate from your vehicle. There will be no crating inside the buildings.
- 7. **Parking.** A designated parking area will be available at the venue.
- 8. Clean up after your dog and don't let them potty on anything manmade.

- 11. The HKC will use care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 12.It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Scent Detection Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit, on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
- 13. If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond control of the management, it is impossible to openor to complete the Trials, no refund of entries will be made
