#### Equipment and course familiarization:

- Electronic Timers will be used.
- Rubberized Contacts
- There will be NO contact equipment familiarization.
- A warm up area with a single practice jump will be provided for dogs entered in the trials.
- NO toys that make squeaky sounds will be permitted within 15 feet of the rings.
- Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class
- As per CKC Rules move ups are allowed one hour prior to commencement of the start of each trial each day. Same day move ups will be allowed.
- Day of entries allowed (space permitting) up to one hour prior to the commencement of the start of trials each day.
- We will try to accommodate dogs with conflicts in conformation/obedience/rally provided handlers inform gate stewards in advance, however we cannot hold the rings. Handlers please call out your dog's name to the scribe when entering the ring.

# **CKC AGILITY HEIGHT CLASSES**

Height Divisions - owners are responsible for entering the correct height divisions. The judge may require any dog to be measured.


# VETERANS CLASSES: Standard, JWW, Steeplechase Jumps and Tunnels & PAD

8 or 12 inches------ for dogs over 14 inches up to and including 18 inches at the witners 12 or 16 inches ----- for dogs over 18 inches up to and including 22 inches at the withers

16 or 20 inches ---- -for dogs over 22 inches at the withers

The following breeds, or mixed breed dogs that resemble these breeds in relation to weight to shoulder height ratios, are permitted (but not required) to jump either ONE or TWO jump height(s) lower than the designated shoulder height when they show in the Selected division.

Small Breeds: Basset Hound, Bulldog, Cesky Terrier, Clumber spaniel, Dachshund (all six varieties), Dandie Dinmont Terrier, French bulldog, Pekingese, Petit Basset Griffon Vendeen, Scottish Terrier, Sealyham Terrier, Skye Terrier, Welsh Corgi (Cardigan & Pembroke)

# Entries will be accepted after the pre-entry deadline with the following conditions:

- There will be no discount packages allowed; the price of each run will be \$30.00.
- Entry must be received by 1 hour prior to the scheduled start of the trial being entered.
- Additional classes added after pre-entry closing to an existing entry will be processed at the exhibitor's previous discount, no further discounts will be applied.
- FFO\* (For Fun Only) Runs are NOT included in the discounted total run fee. No refunds will be given for any difference in fees already paid if an exhibitor switches a regular run to a FFO run at the trial.
- CASH ONLY FOR POST CLOSING ENTRIES
- NO Refunds will be given after early bird close of entries (July 22, 2024 at 10pm MDT) except in the case of a bitch in season or an injured dog see rules on the next page.

Cheques post-dated up until closing date of entries will be accepted as meeting the closing date. Cheques post-dated after pre-entry date will be accepted at post deadline rate – NO DISCOUNTS ALLOWED.

### **VOLUNTEER RULES**

ANYONE volunteering or AKC representative who is in the ring is NOT to have a cell phone, or any food or drink except water. For liability reasons, <u>ALL</u> "ring Crew" (volunteer/AKC representative) must be AT least 14 years of age unless previously approved by the AKC Agility committee. Proof of age may be requested. There will be volunteer basket draw for each day.

#### **Bitch in Season**

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in Agility, Rally/Obedience comes into season after the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10-day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Show Secretary on or before the starting date and time of the trial. The Alberta Kennel Club will refund entry, recording and TCN fees if the above conditions are met. A 50% refund of entry fees only will be made for a bitch in season without a veterinarian's certificate with written notification presented to the Show Secretary at least <u>ONE HOUR</u> before the start of the Trials. The bitch must be available to be examined by the Show Superintendent to verify she is in season.

#### <u>Injured Dogs (12-05-19)</u>

6.11.1 If a dog is injured after entry has been submitted to the Trial Secretary, a veterinarian's certificate, certifying the dog was injured before a 3-day period preceding the trial, must reach the Trial Secretary on or before the start of the trial. The trial-giving club may refund the entry fee but will keep a service charge and TCN fee. The refund and the terms thereof must be clearly stated in the premium list. The Alberta Kennel Club will be keeping a \$5/run service fee and any TCN fees collected (if applicable).

# No other refunds will be issued after early bird closing (July 22, 2024).

Section 9.9 Effective January 1, 2024

The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date(s) of the event(s).

#### Section 19.7

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

### **AGILITY ONLY BENCHING RULES**

Pre-paid reserved benching, near the agility rings, will be available to CKC agility exhibitors beginning at 2:00 pm Thursday, Aug 1. You MUST reserve benching for this area. Very limited space will be available free of charge in the Day Benching area. THERE WILL BE NO SHADE TENT FOR DAY BENCHING PROVIDED THIS YEAR, SO PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY. Spots will be first come first served and once the day space is filled no other spots will be made available. Nothing can remain in the Day Benching area overnight. No overnight benching is allowed other than the prepaid reserved benching. You will be asked to move if you are benched outside of designated benching areas.

- There are NO Generators allowed on the field.
- Grass Mats and tents with floors are allowed this year!
- The 12 x 12 spaces are on the sand agility ring
- The 24 x 24 pens are on cobblestone, so tent weights or tie downs will be required rather than tent pegs. These pens are enclosed by the galvanized steel cattle pens with gates.
- All benching tents (Conformation, Obedience/Rally & Agility) must be pegged to the ground and dropped when leaving for the night.
- Dogs are not to be left in field benching tents overnight.
- Contact information must be posted on the outside of your benching area in the event of an emergency.
- Generators must be placed on boards and are not to interfere with fellow exhibitors/vendors. These must be placed along the fence line and not interfere with any tents. Ensure you have a long extension cord to reach your benching spot and please bring a cable and lock to secure your generator to the fence. The AKC is not liable for any stolen generators. Loud obnoxious generators are not permitted.
- Benching in designated areas only; no benching out of your vehicle on roadside shoulders or in adjacent parking areas.
- AKC reserves the right to require vehicles be moved if parking in non-designated areas.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ACCESSING THE 2024 AKC SUMMER CLASSIC

The 2024 AKC Summer Classic is operating under Foothills County Special Event Development Permit 24D 081.

Highway AB-2A is a major throughfare and approaching 306 Ave E from the North on 2A requires a left turn across busy lanes of traffic at an uncontrolled intersection. Please refer to the following maps and instructions for access to the show grounds.

Please proceed to the entrance of the Okotoks Agricultural Society (OAS) Grounds

from 306 Ave E to be escorted to your RV/Day Parking space

Thursday August 1, 2024 – 8 am to 10 pm – RV Arrival

Thursday, August 1, 2024 – 2 pm to 10 pm Day Parking Benching Setup

If you cannot enter the grounds because of traffic into the show site,
Foothills County and the Okotoks Agricultural Society have requested that
vehicles NOT stop to wait on 306 Ave E.

The road is not wide enough to permit waiting.
Please go around again to the 306 Ave E exit off AB-2 S.

Traffic control will be provided by Volker Stevin on 306 Avenue E, both East and West, the speed limit will be 50 km/hour when the flaggers are on the road.

Parking is not first come, first served. Your space is assigned to you by the parking/security volunteers. Please be patient, this is a new location for all of us.

The Alberta Kennel Club, its Board of Directors, staff, volunteers, contract employees and agents are not responsible for any damages to any party arising from the entry or egress to the Okotoks Agricultural Society Grounds (the Grounds) or from any activity taking place at the Grounds.


# 1. ARRIVING AT THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS FROM THE NORTH



WHEN APPROACHING FROM THE NORTH USING RIGHT-HAND TURNS OFF HIGHWAYS

- 1. Heading South on AB-2 S (PAST EXIT 222) (3.7 KM)
- 2. Turn right onto 306 Ave E (right turn lane onto 306 Ave E) (2.0 KM)
- 3. Turn left into Okotoks Agricultural Society Grounds

# 2. LEAVING THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS TO THE NORTH



- 1. Head west on 306 Ave E toward 17 St E (400 m)
- 2. Turn right onto AB-2A N (2.8 KM)
- 3. Use any lane to merge onto AB-2 N/AB-2A N via the ramp to AB-2A N/Calgary (2.5 KM)
- Keep right to continue on Deerfoot Trail / AB-2 N, follow signs for Trans-Canada Hwy E / AB-1 E (4.6 KM)

### 3. ARRIVING AT THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS FROM THE SOUTH



WHEN APPROACHING FROM THE SOUTH, USING RIGHT-HAND TURNS off HIGHWAYS

- 1. Heading North on AB-2 N
- 2. Take EXIT 209 toward Diamond Valley / Aldersyde / High River (700 m)
- 3. Use the left lane to take the AB-7 W ramp to Okotoks (170 m)
- 4. Turn left onto AB-7 W (1.0 KM)
- Use right lane to turn onto Hwy 7 E / AB-2a N / AB-7 W (signs for Okotoks / Black Diamond / Turner Valley) (5.9 KM)
- 6. Turn right onto AB -2a N (8.5 KM)
- 7. Turn right onto 306 Ave E (350 m)
- 8. Turn right into Okotoks Agriculture Society Grounds

# 4. LEAVING THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS TO THE SOUTH



- 1. Head west on 306 Ave E toward 17 St E (400 m)
- 2. Turn right onto AB-2A N (2.3 KM)
- 3. Use the right lane to merge onto AB-2 S via the ramp to Fort Macleod (28.1 KM)

#### CROSSING HWY 2A AT A CONTROLLED INTERSECTION

- 1. Leaving the OAS Grounds, turn right onto 306 Ave E
- 2. Turn right onto 32 St E / Range Road 293
- 3. Turn right onto 338 Ave E / Township Rd 210
- 4. Cross Hwy 2A at lights and make first right turn towards S.A.V.E (6.3km)

# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

# **RV Parking:**

RV Parking or Overnight Tenting is permitted in designated areas only.

AKC reserves the right to require vehicles be moved if parking in non-designated areas.

# Please note the following parking requirements/restrictions:

- 1. Overnight parking is available from 8:00 am 10pm Thursday, August 1, 2024. If your RV parking site is adjacent to the competition fields, you will not be allowed to park your RV during show hours. Those arriving after 10 pm must NOT park themselves! SECURITY WILL BE ON-SITE; you will be asked to exit and go to the nearest parking lot for the evening and return to the entrance at 7 am the next day where you will be escorted to your spot. This is a safety issue for the Alberta Kennel Club and ignoring this request will result in withdrawal of the right to park on the show grounds.
- 2. Those wishing to park together must arrive together, this includes "group" parking NO EXCEPTIONS
- 3. Space changing will not be permitted. All vehicles must park as directed by parking personnel.
- 4. If you have prepaid for a spot in our Handicapped area, you must provide a valid, government issued handicapped placard, and if you do not have one of these, we will have to assign you to another available space.
- 5. Once your RV is parked you will not be able to remove (designated areas only, please refer to the site map) from the facility until the show closes on Monday, August 5, 2024. If you need to leave during the weekend, you may do so before 8:00 am or after Best in Show, once you have vacated you will not be able to enter the park with your RV again.
- 6. Tow-vehicles must fit into assigned space (not in the aisle or fire lanes).
- 7. Grass mats are not permitted on any of the grass RV areas, grass mats ARE permitted in the gravel/sand areas only.
- 8. Please ensure you have planks / wood for under your tires / jacks to avoid any sinking into the grass areas in the event of heavy rain. Be sure to have leveling material for your unit as some of the RV parking ground is mildly uneven.
- 9. RV Parking is on gravel or grass (or mixture of both). Motorhome exhaust pipes must be vented up (mandatory); portable generators must be placed on a board and not directly on the gravel/grass.
- 10. Water & electrical hook-ups are NOT available on any RV parking areas
- 11. Please ensure GENERATORS ARE OFF between the hours of 11:00 PM and 6:00 AM this is the designated "quiet time" for our friends and neighbours. This is per Foothills County Community Standards Bylaw and the Dark Sky Bylaw.
- 12. The OAS does not allow fire pits of any kind allowed (wood/propane). Propane BBQs are OK. Per Permit 24D 081
- 13. No Fresh Water on site for filling your RV, ensure to have your freshwater tank full before you arrive.
- 14. No dumping of gray water or sewage is allowed. Please keep your sites CLEAN.
- 15. All parking is at your own risk:
  - a. THE ALBERTA KENNEL CLUB IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR WEATHER RELATED DAMAGE TO PERSONAL PROPERTY. PLEASE BE PREPARED FOR UNFORSEEN EVENTS ESPECIALLY WIND AND/OR HAIL.
  - b. If you must leave the show grounds, dogs in your care must be moved inside your unit. DOGS MAY NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED IN ANY OUTDOOR ENCLOSURE or space. FAILURE TO COMPLY may result in excusal from the show.
  - c. Please ensure that awnings are down and/or secured if you are leaving the show grounds.
  - d. All set-ups are required to have a contact phone number posted in case of emergency.
- 16. No benching out of your car in the day parking areas. Dogs are not to be left in cars in the day parking areas.
- 17. There will be no people movers at the show. Please provide your own method of moving your equipment.

# **Vehicle Day Parking:**

- 1. Move-in Thursday, August 1, 2024 @ 2 pm
- 2. If you have a generator, please secure with a lock and bring your own power cords (at least 100' in length). Generators on the Polocrosse field must be placed on the South side of the field by the chain link fencing. Covered Stalls, please place your generator outside of the stall.
- 3. Your contact information must be visible in your benching area in the event of an emergency.
- 4. You are responsible for leaving your benching area as you found it.
- 5. All benching must be vacated 1 hour following Best in Show on Monday, August 5, 2024.
- 6. Absolutely no vehicles on the fields at any time, please ensure you have a cart/trolley to move your items to your reserved benching spot.
- 7. Pick-up/Drop-off must be before 8:00 am, immediately unload, then park your vehicle in a designated area. You may only pick up after the BIS events have completed.

Generators (civilized ones please, excessively loud generators will not be permitted) are permitted in the day tenting area, however the generators must be housed up against the fence line and at no time are to infringe on your neighbors' space so that exhaust fumes would enter their area. Please ensure you have a long extension cord if you are using a generator.
- 13. You are responsible for leaving your space as you found it.... **CLEAN!** Please ensure that you have a rake/tool handy to clean up your area, left behind garbage, dog hair, rubber bands, etc. are not the responsibility of the Alberta Kennel Club Volunteers. We thank you for your cooperation in this regard!
