Judge Biographies

MARGARET HENIGMAN

I can't think of a time in my life when dogs didn't play a significant role. I came from a large family and we always had dogs growing up in New Westminster. I started obedience training my very own first pup in 1960. Tass was a Lab/Samoyed cross and I was to learn that she was a real handful with a mind of her own but with a huge heart. She taught me a lot about the value of patience and consistency in working with this amazing species. Years later and after raising my daughters I moved to Nanaimo where I was active in Obedience and Agility with my Shelties. In 1999, I completed my first UD with Marpoint's Charlotte Harlot OTCh. Carley was also a wonderful clown and she sealed my love of Obedience and Rally Obedience. She also sparked my interest in judging. Eventually, I was smitten by the intelligence and wonderful attitude of Papillons. I completed 2 more UDs with Ch Keandas Blazing Rainbows OTCh and Ch Littlewing's Tiddlywinks OTCh, RAE. My youngest, Ch Littlewing's Satin Flower CD is currently very active in Scent Detection for which I am also licensed under CKC rules. I have so enjoyed judging and am constantly inspired by the courage and love shown by Obedience competitors for their wonderful dogs and look forward to many more years as an Obedience and Rally Judge.

DAVID FREI

New York Magazine once called David Frei "probably the most famous human in the world of canines." As the co-host of NBC's National Dog Show Presented by Purina since its inception in 2002, David is seen every Thanksgiving Day by the largest TV audience for any dog show - more than 25 million viewers each year. It is the same role that he perfected in 27 years as the longtime (1990-2016) co-host of USA Network's Westminster Dog Show. He has now added to his NBC duties as co-host of the Beverly Hills Dog Show, which debuted in 2017.

In 2018, David was inducted into the prestigious Dog Writers Association of America's Hall of Fame. *Petside.com* named him as the Pet Person of the Year in 2011, and in 2015, *Dog Fancy* magazine, in its final issue, included him in a retrospective, "45 People Who Changed the Dog World." For many years, David's charity, Angel On A Leash, created and advocated for therapy dog programs many places, expanding nationwide and receiving many honors for its wonderful accomplishments.

A breeder-owner-handler and judge in the world of purebred dogs for more than 40 years, his dog, Ch. Stormhill's Who's Zoomin' Who, was the top Afghan Hound in the country in 1989 and retired as the top-winning female in the history of the breed. He is licensed by the AKC for Afghan Hounds, Cavalier King Charles Spaniels and Brittanys. He has officiated at shows in the U.S., Canada, Australia, Denmark and China.

MARY BETH SQUIRREL

I was introduced to Cavalier King Charles Spaniels when I was 13 years old and working my first job with our local Veterinarian. She owned a tricolour girl that immediately stole my heart. Several years later, I purchased my first Cavalier; a beautiful tricolor girl that I named Zoey. Even though I bought Zoey as a pet, her breeder encouraged me to join our regional and national club, so I did.

Prior to getting involved with dogs, I was active in showing hunter ponies, and had a special interest in showing and breeding Murray Grey's, a rare breed beef cattle. I learned about pedigrees, genetics, artificial insemination/frozen semen and using breeding to help preserve and improve traits from my grandmother. She was a talented farmer that had her own beautiful herd of Hereford's. I also became involved in the 4-H judging program and won the provincial competition at the Royal Winter Fair for horses.

Although breeding and showing dogs was new to me, it was filled with similar fundamentals as livestock. After a few shows with Zoey, I realized she was not the strongest in show potential, yet that "bug" had already struck. It wasn't long before I was making my efforts toward having my own Cavalier breeding program. My foundation was a black and tan bitch that we named Molly (CH Mysticmoon's Danika, ROM). It took me several years of learning, and a few mistakes before I connected with Karen to get Molly. I had NO interest in

having a black and tan. Truth be told, I didn't really like them. Molly though was sound, very typey, and had that infectious cavalier temperament. She also had lots of good health behind her, thanks to the conscientious breeders in her pedigree. The joke was on me when she had her first litter, and I found out that she was black and tan dominant. My next generation would also all be black and tan! These days, I breed all 4 colours, but still have a special interest and fondness for whole colours.

Since Molly, there's been multiple Canadian championships, some grand championships, multiple majors in the US, and a few register of merits earned. Now, I've been taking interest in judging, and again in many ways it's familiar to my past. I've been focused on taking assignments when I can, accumulating my ring stewarding hours, and working towards completing the requirements to submit my application for my permit. Thank you so much for inviting me to judge your sweepstakes.

RICK ALDOUS

After growing up with various dogs, my introduction to the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel came in 1985 acquiring a pet Blenheim. What an affectionate and endearing breed they are, with those big round, expressive eyes that could never fail to win you over!

My interest grew to exhibiting and breeding in the mid 90's after believing a crazy tricolour girl we acquired was good enough to show. She wasn't that spe-cial, though placing at all shows attended, and was disastrous in the whelping box! But, this interest lead to a serious hobby of exhibiting and breeding com-bined. Our breeding today goes back to the 2 original girls we started our line with 26 years ago, both Ch Telvara Karban Kopy daughters that culminated in my first UK Champion in 2004, Ch. Aranel Ballistic, who also won Best of Breed at Crofts the following year.

Success continued and I have been fortunate to breed 9 UK Champions, many Champions worldwide and also some of our males proving worthy stud dogs for us and other breeders in the UK and abroad. In particular, Aranel Bombastic, Ch Aranel Cosmic, Ch Aranel Genesis. Overseas, AKC Grand Ch Aranel Renais-sance, CKCS-USA Ch Aranel Revelation and CKCS-USA Ch Aranel Colby have produced numerous winning offspring. After a spell owning Japanese Chins, we had a UK Japanese Chin Champion and her litter brother, a Swedish Champion.

I've served on dog clubs since 1999 and have served on The Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club committee since 2014 currently in the role as Vice Chairman sup-porting the very capable Michael Levy.

I first judged in 1998 and awarded Challenge Certificates for the first time in 2011. Since then, I've had the privilege of judging in many countries in Europe and North America including the U.S.A, AKC and CKCSC-USA.

I look forward to judging the Canadian National and consider it an honour to be invited and thank the Canadian National board for the appointment.

JOHN GOODWIN

My appreciation and love for animal husbandry goes back to being a child growing up in Littleton, Colorado. My family has raised horses and sporting breed dogs since I can remember ... it has been, and continues to be, a multigenerational passion. We got involved in Cavaliers after years of breed study and visiting dog shows over 13 years ago. Before my career in education, I was a founding member in building Travelocity.com and have held various other roles inside the travel industry... JEAN-JACQUES DUPAS

Mr. Dupas has been the owner/handler of Afghans (one of his dogs was shown with success in the USA in 1983); the owner/handler of Berger des Pyrenees; the owner of Shih Tsu and Cavalier King Charles Spaniels. He has show his dogs in France, Belgium, Netherlands, Germany, Switzerland, Tchecoslovaquie, Austria, Yougoslavia, Spain, Italy, Portugal and Luxembourg.

He is presently the President of Club St Hubert du Nord (Kennel Club for the north of France), is now the Treasurer of the Club du Caniche de France (Poodle Club), and has been the President of the Afghan and Saluki French Club, the President of the Greyhound French Club, the President of the Poodle Club of France, Secretary of the Bergers des Pyrenees and Pyrenean Mountain Dog French clubs and the Secretary of the French Kennel Club (SCC).

He started judging in 1989. Rules and Regulations

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

Dogs should be in the building at least one hour prior to ring time. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the posted schedule and be at ringside at the time of judging. The club will not call individual dogs to ringside. Please remain at ringside until judging is completed. A practice ring will be set up in the benching area. Regular rings must not be used for this purpose. Dogs must be exercised in the areas provided, anyone exercising their dogs on the grounds outside the building and not cleaning up after them, will be excluded from the show or trial.

Exhibitors are reminded to respect hospitality facilities. The Club reserves the right to refuse future entries from any exhibitor who creates excessive destructive or disruption to host facilities (Hotel, motel or campground). The show superintendent is in complete charge of the shows and trials which, are governed by CKC rules. No judge or any other person participating in any capacity at a dog show held under CKC rules shall be subjected to an indignity of any kind during the progress of the show. The Show Committee has a responsibility to see that this rule is enforced. Chapter 19.7, Page 55, CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations.

The Dog Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune. The Club and the specialty club reserves the right to remove from the shows or trials any person or dog for any just cause. Any

dog excused by the show superintendent or veterinarian, for any reason, shall not compete in any classes or accept any awards for the duration of the shows or trials.

If because of riot, civil disturbance, or any other acts beyond the control of the show committee, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refunds shall be made!

EXTRACTS FROM THE DOG SHOW RULES - BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS AND STAKES

CONFORMATION CLASSES OFFERED:

No refund of any fees will be made.

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section. All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

JUNIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs at least six months of age and under nine months of age on the day of the show.

SENIOR PUPPY: shall be for dogs 9 months of age and under twelve (12) months of age on the day of the show.

12-18 MONTH - for dogs over 12 months of age but under 18 months of age. (divided by Age)

CANADIAN BRED: shall be for dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded

BRED BY EXHIBITOR: shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

To be eligible for the Bred By Exhibitor Award at the Interior Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club Specialty, exhibitors MUST check the box on the entry form to be eligible. And Breeder/Owner MUST handle dog at ALL levels of competition to be eligible for this award. To be eligible for the Bred By Exhibitor Award at both of the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club of Canada Specialties, exhibitors MUST be entered in the Bred by Class.

OPEN CLASS: shall be for all dogs. (divided by color)

VETERAN Dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. This class at a specialty MAY be divided by age. The winners of all of the Veteran's classes will come back into the ring to compete for Best of Breed. (divided by Age - 7 years and under 9 years - 9 years and under 11 years - 11+ years).

SPECIALS ONLY: is for dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Championship status including at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level. Should a dog which is entered in this class be found either not to be registered or has not completed the requirements for Championship status, all awards earned at the show will be cancelled. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible.

UNOFFICIAL/NON-REGULAR CLASSES OFFERED

(with the exception of Baby Puppy all entries in these classes MUST be entered in a regular Class or as Exhibition Only)

BABY PUPPY Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

BRACE At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

STUD DOG Stud dog and 2 or more of his get, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Get MUST be entered in a Regular Class.

BROOD BITCH Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Progeny MUST be entered in a Regular Class ALTERED: Eligibility for the Sexually Altered Dog Classes shall be limited to dogs over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered Dog Class judging. These classes will be judged immediately after Best of Breed of the regular classes. Two classes will be offered: Altered Male & Altered Female. Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each class will be declared Winners and the second place winner will be declared Reserve Winners. The Altered Winners Male and the Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best of Breed Altered and Best of Opposite Sex Altered in breed. (OFFERED at the Cavalier King Charles Club of Canada Specialties on June 3 and 4th ONLY!)

Best of The Four Colors: Blenheim, Tri Color, Black and Tan, Ruby OBEDIENCE CLASSES OFFERED:

Novice A, Novice B, Novice C, Novice Intermediate, Open HA, Open HB, Open 18A, Open 18B, Utility A, Utility B, Pre -Novice, Veterans and Exhibition Only

RALLY OBEDIENCE CLASSES OFFERED:

Novice A & Novice B, Intermediate, Advanced A & B, Excellent A & B, Masters and Exhibition Only

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you pay by credit card, bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

Entries sent by <u>Courier must be sent prepaid</u>; To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club, we will be unable to accept any entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing time and date.

Entries sent requiring a signature WILL NOT BE accepted.

Please allow ample time for delays in the mail.

Exhibitors Please Note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but **written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary not later than closing date and time.** If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in Rally/Obedience comes into season after the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Show Secretary before the starting date and the time of the trial. The Club will refund entry, recording and listing fees if the above conditions are met. No Refunds will be given for the service fees provided by the dogshow.ca

A 50% refund of entry fees only will be made for a bitch in season without a Veterinarian's certificate with written notification presented to the Show Secretary at least ONE HOUR before the start of the Trials for performance events ONLY. The bitch must be available to be examined by the Show Superintendent to verify she is in season.

There will be no refunds on duplicate entries or overpayments.





Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the conformation, Obedience and Rally Rules set out by the Canadian Kennel Club.

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

15.1 Championship Points

- 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.
- 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:
- *Includes the dog awarded Winners
- In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.
- 15.1.3 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Breed at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.4 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing in Specials Only shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.5 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification:

- Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Dog shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.
- 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

- 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.
- 15.1.10 Permission shall be granted a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group.
- 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.
- 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must:
- (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges;
- (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN);
- (c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.
- 15.1.13 The Board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean:
- (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level;
- (b) each of the three (3) judge's awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing;
- (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Breed or group placing.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh)

- 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.
- 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.
- 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System

Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- (c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.
- In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.
- 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- (b)To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.
- NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.
- 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
