

EXHIBITORS ENTERING THEIR VERY FIRST SHOW: Entry fee will be 50% discounted for the weekend for new exhibitors at NKC shows, not for exhibitors who have shown before but have a new dog.

EXHIBITORS ENTERING MORE THAN 2 DOGS PER EVENT: (dogs to be owned by the exhibitor but do not have to all be owned by the breeder): for every 2 dogs entered in an event, the 3rd will be free (professional handlers excluded).

Please make all cheques and money orders payable to the 'Newfoundland (All **Breed) Kennel Club.**" Credit card entries can be accepted by show/trial secretary. or at DogShow.ca. WEBSITE: www.dogshow.ca -> Please: note the change from last year's show service and use the new service. <-

A listing fee must be paid with the entry fee if the dog does not have an individual CKC registration number. The litter registration number cannot be accepted.

NOTE: there is no listing fee for 3-6 month puppies.

Please note that fees are payable in Canadian funds. Due to fluctuating currency, discounted cheques will not be accepted.

Personal cheques will be accepted, however they are payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques 'Payable in Canadian Funds' or 'At Par' as they will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds.

Attention all Exhibitors: You may submit your entry using Dogshow.ca. This is a privately owned business that charges a fee for its service.

Important: Entries accepted until **8 p.m. closing date**Visa, MasterCard & American Express Accepted

ENTRY INFORMATION

- No dog under six months of age is permitted to enter the show premises except, puppies 3-6 months that are entered in the Baby Puppy Class OR are pre-registered by the owner on or before the closing date and time – the owner must have other dog(s) entered in regular show classes (these puppies will not be listed in the catalogue).
- 2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fee.
- Tendering of an NSF cheque as payment of entry fees shall be considered to be nonpayment of entry fees and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.
- 4. Entrants must abide by any errors made in entering their dogs. The Show/Trial Secretary will not be responsible for checking the accuracy of entries. An error in an age-specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended up to 1 hour before the start of the show.
- 5. The committee reserves the right to refuse entries subject to CKC rules.
- The Show/Trial Secretary is unable to accept or cancel entries after the closing date with the exception of Day of Event Entries (Sunday Nov. 15, 2015 only).
- 7. Telephone, fax, or any other electronic entries are prohibited except in such circumstances as the CKC Board of Directors may otherwise authorize. (see the relevant sections Dog Show and Trial Rules and Regulations).
- 8. Every dog entered in a championship show must be registered or eligible for registration in the Stud Book of the CKC.
- Entry forms must be completed in full. Incomplete entry forms must be rejected by the show-giving club and returned. Please double-check your entry.
 No one shall have any claim or recourse against the organization holding the show/trial or any official connected therewith for the refusal of an entry.

CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATINGS

Chapter 15.1 SECTION 1 - A dog awarded Winners at a Championship Show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to the dog awarded winners shall be as provided hereunder:

SECTION 2:

Dogs competing * 1 2 3-5 6-9 10-12 13 or more Points allocated 0 1 2 3 4 5

* includes the dog awarded winners.

SECTION 8: The system provides for additional points if the dog awarded WINNERS also places in the Group.

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an All Breed Championship Show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points won at the Breed or Group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at a single show.

In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion it must win at least 10 points under 3 different judges, which includes at least one 2-point win. This 2-point win must be at the breed or group level.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- On the day of the show/trial, the Show/Trial Superintendent has complete charge of the show/trial.
- After the closing of entries, a receipt, exhibitor's pass and judging schedule will be sent by email(if available) or regular mail to all exhibitors.
- Exhibitor's passes must be presented at the entrance of the show/trial premises. Only
 dogs entered in the show/trial will be admitted.
- The building will be opened 1 (one) hour before the start of the show/trial.
- Dogs may be removed from the building when not required for judging.
- Dogs must not be left in the building over night.
- Judging will proceed without any dog, if the dog is not present when called by the ring steward.
- The Show/Trial Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability, in the event of an accident or other misfortune to either dogs or patrons.
- If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or complete the show/trial, no refund of entry fees will be made.
- We regret that trailer hookups will **not** be available at the show site.
- It shall be the duty and obligation of the show giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities.
- The Conformation Show/Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation. The Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
- The show/trial grounds are defined as the exterior walls of the St. John's Recreational Center, Buckmaster's Circle, St. John's, Newfoundland.
- The authorities of the show/trial may decline to accept entries for just cause, or may remove any dog from the show/trial building due to disease or viciousness.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS Please Read and Observe the Following:

- Stoop and Scoop. All exhibitors <u>are required</u> to clean up after their dogs both inside and outside the Show Facility, as per City Bylaws. Clean up bags, garbage bins and tools are available for this purpose at the door and throughout the Show Site. Failure to comply jeopardizes the club's access to this venue. Exhibitors who do not comply with this policy may be denied entry to NKC shows for one full year.
- 2. Silicone based products. Use of silicone-based aerosol products applied to dog's coats are discouraged and can <u>ONLY</u> be used where the floor has been covered to prevent the product from being sprayed directly onto the floor. These products create serous safety hazards over several days of continuous use. In the past this has required professional cleaning to restore the floor surface after shows. The NKC does not assume responsibility for the cost of removal of this product from the Show Site floor. Exhibitors who use these products and do not properly cover their set up will be required to cover the cost of cleaning following the Shows if requested by the landlord.

NOTE: Exhibitors may cover the floor with plastic, paper or fabric material and can be secured with Painter's tape. (Duct tape is NOT permissible).

3. Bring your own chair. The NKC provides a limited number of chairs for exhibitors at ring side. Exhibitors must bring their own chair for use at their personal set ups.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB - Non-Member Participation Fee Policy (Effective January 1, 2011)

Non-member participation fee:

- a) An annual fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have the option to become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in all awards and titles being cancelled.
- c) All Premium Lists will carry a note stating the fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non members and is not applicable to CKC members.

Information:

A non member resident in Canada is subject to the fee. Dogs co-owned with a CKC member are exempt. There are 2 options for non-members:

- a) Join the CKC.
- b) Pay the Non-Member Participation Fee.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

Baby Puppy A dog 3 months up to 6 months on the day of the show Junior Puppy A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show

Senior Puppy A dog between 9 months and up to 12 months on the day of the show 12-18 Months A dog between 12 months and up to 18 months on the day of the show

Canadian Bred A dog which was born in Canada

Bred by Exhibitor A dog owned and handled by the breeder

Open Class A dog 6 months of age or older Specials Only Dogs who are Canadian Champions

Exhibition Only Dogs 6 months and over not in competition. Dogs 3 months of age and

under 6 months of age on the day of the show may be entered in Exhibition Only providing that the owner of the puppies has also entered a dog in one $\frac{1}{2}$

of the regular official classes.

Veterans

Dogs must be 7 years of age or olderyears of on the date of the show and May be spayed or neutered. These dogs do not compete for Best of Breed.

These dogs do not have to be entered in Exhibition Only. This class will be

judged after Baby Puppy.

Altered Limited to dogs and bitches over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered

by veterinarian procedure.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Official: Pre-novice, Novice A, B, & C, Novice Intermediate, Open A & B, Utility A & B **Note:** Pre-novice, Novice C and Novice Intermediate classes are not eligible for High in Trial.

Separate entries are required for each class entered.

Entries must State Jump Heights.

Pre-Novice "A" Classes "B" Classes	For all purebred dogs over 6 months of age (not eligible for HIT Competition). For dogs handled by owner or immediate family member through all exercises. For trainers, multiple entries, exhibitors who have attained a Cdn. OTCh. degree or dogs who have earned titles in another country.
C C	,
"C" Classes	For dogs who have completed a C.D. title in Canada (not eligible for H.I.T. competition).
C.D.I. Class	Novice-Intermediate, for dogs who have earned a C.D. title in Canada (not eligible for H.I.T. Competition).
Open	For dogs who have earned a C.D. in Canada.
Utility A	For dogs who have earned a C.D.X. but not a U.D.in Canada.
Utility B	For dogs who have earned a C.D.X. or U.D. in Canada
Exhibition	Dogs 6 months & over, not in competition.

RALLY OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Exhibitors entering both Obedience and Rally must fill out separate entry forms

Novice A	For dogs that have not earned the RN title or a CD or higher and is handled by the owner or immediate family member.
Novice B	For any dog until such time as a qualifying score in Advanced is earned.
Intermediate	For dogs that have earned the RN title
Advanced A	For dogs that have earned the RN title but not earned the RA title and is handled by the owner or immediate family member.
Advanced B	For any dog that has earned the RN title.
Excellent A	For dogs that have earned the RA title but not earned the RE title and is handled by the owner or immediate family member.
Excellent B	For any dog that has earned the RA title.

A Bitch in season **may not** compete in Obedience or Rally Trials. Entry fees will be refunded **ONLY** if the Trial Secretary BEFORE commencement of the trial receives a Veterinarian's Certificate.

JUNIOR CONFORMATION CLASSES

Competitors are asked to please fill out the pre-registration form included.

Peewee Handlers 4 years of age up to 6 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year. This is a non-competitive class.

Junior Novice Handlers 7 to 10 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

Junior Open Handlers 7 to 10 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have won 6 first places with competition.

Intermediate Novice Class Handlers 11 to 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

Intermediate Open Class Handlers 11 to 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year

preceding the competition year, who have won 6 places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open Level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level.

Senior Novice handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year and up to 18 years of age, who have not won 6 first places with competition in this class. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.

Senior Open This class is for handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year and up to 18 years of age, who have won 6 first places with competition, in the Senior Novice Class, and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level. Best overall is optional at the discretion of the host club.

JUNIOR OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Competitors are asked to please fill out the pre-registration form included.

Junior Pre-Novice Open to handlers 7 years of age and up to and including 10 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have not achieved 500 score points in any Pre-Novice competition.

Intermediate Obedience Pre-Novice Open to handlers 11 years of age and up to and including 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have not achieved 500 score points in any Pre-Novice competition.

Senior Obedience Pre-Novice Open to handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year and up to 18 years of age, who have not achieved 500 points in any Pre-Novice competition.

Junior Obedience Novice Open to handlers 7 years of age and up to and including 10 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have achieved 500 score points in any Pre-Novice competition or for any junior of relevant age who wishes to compete in this class.

Intermediate Obedience Novice Open to handlers 11 years of age and up to and including 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have achieved 500 score points in any Pre- Novice competition or for any junior of relevant age who wishes to compete in this class.

Senior Obedience Novice Open to handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year and up to 18 years of age, who have achieved 500 score points in any Pre-Novice competition or for any junior of relevant age who wishes to compete in this class.

Junior Obedience Open Open to handlers 7 years of age and up to and including 10 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year.

Intermediate Obedience Open Open to handlers 11 years of age and up to and including 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year.

Senior Obedience Open Open to handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year and up to 18 years of age. Any dog may be used at the Pre-Novice, or Novice level including those with any Obedience titles. A dog used at the Open level must have a CD title (either CKC and/or AKC).

Junior's Obedience Regulations:

- 9.3 Size, temperament and manageability of the dog must be appropriate for the handler.
- 9.4 Juniors must enter (at their appropriate age level) either Pre-Novice, Novice or Open.
- 9.5 Once a junior competes in Novice or Open they may never enter Pre-Novice. Should such occur, any points would be disallowed and any ribbons or prizes must be returned to the trial giving club.
- 9.6 Handlers may compete in Novice and/or Open for as long as they wish (within age restrictions).
- 9.7 Junior Obedience competitions shall be performed as summarized below:

- (a) Junior, Intermediate and Senior Pre-Novice Classes.
 - (i) All exercises are on leash
 - (ii) Heel on Leash, Stand for Examination, Recall, Long Sit and Long Down.
- (b) Junior, Intermediate and Senior Novice Classes:
 - (i) Same format as titling Novice except Group exercises have different durations.
- (c) Junior, Intermediate and Senior Open Classes
 - (i) Same format as titling Open except Group exercises have different duration.
