Entries will close at 8:00pm sharp on Monday, June 09, 2014 (or when entry limit of dogs has been reached BEFORE June 09, 2014). The draw for the running order will be held immediately after the close OF ENTRIES at the home of the field test secretary. Starting time will be determined once entries close. The first two dogs running at the test will be notified by phone or email. *No refunds once the tests are closed either by date or entries.

Day of Test entries WILL be permitted, provided the entry limit of has not been reached, and must be brought to the field test secretary up to minimum thirty minutes prior to the start of the test. Once the limit of dogs has been reached, no more will be accepted. Please bring your dog's CKC registration information with you to avoid a listing fee.

Entry fees: \$55.00 per FDJ, FD, and FDA dog per test. Are to be paid in Canadian funds by cash, cheque or money order payable to the **Atlantic Pointing Breed Club** and must accompany the entry.

Listing Fee: A listing fee as established by The Canadian Kennel Club must accompany the entry of a dog for which a Canadian Kennel Club individual registration number or Event Registration Number (ERN) is not shown on the entry form. This listing fee is \$9.65 (including HST) per dog per test entered and is in addition to the entry fee(s).

All entries for this Field Test are accepted on condition that Vizsla Canada Inc., its officials and members, and landowners, are released from all liabilities for loss, damage or injury sustained by dog, or person in conjunction with, or during the running of, this Field Test. All minors shall be under the direct care and supervision of the parent or guardian.

TEST INFORMATION:
□ Courses & Birds – Quail and Chuckar will be released. Other game birds may be present. The tests will be over a single course with birds released along the course. There may be a bird field. Vizsla Canada Inc. reserves the right in case of a bird shortage, to use alternate bird species.
☐ Gallery - At the handler's discretion, a gallery of up to 6 spectators may be permitted to follow the test dogs. Spectators must wear blaze orange, remain together at all times and shall follow the directions of the judges,marshal & gunners. All other spectators must remain in the camp area.
□ Total entries will be limited to the number of dogs that can be run in approximately 4 hours of judging time.
□ Starting times will be announced after the draw (earliest start will be 8:00 am). Running times are an estimate only and may change due to absentees or dogs "picked up" early. It is the handler's responsibility to be at the start of the course when it is their turn to run.
□ FDJ , FD and FDA dogs will have 20-30 minutes to complete all aspects of the test. Dogs will be run individually in FDJ and FD . Dogs will be braced in FDA .
□ Firearms - Official gunners will be the only persons permitted to carry firearms on the test site. In FD and FDA,shotguns will be fired over dogs with bird work when possible. Shooting will be done by official gunners only. In FDJ blank shells will be fired – please provide your own starting pistol (calibre not less than .22 long).
□ Blaze orange – Blaze orange must be worn by any individual on the course during the all tests.
☐ Bitches in season will be permitted to run at the end of the last test on Sunday and only after all other dogs have run.
Collaring a dog will be allowed only at the judge's instruction.
Tracking Collars that are legal for use in Canada ad listed online at www.akc.org/events/firel-trails/pointing-breeds/tracking-collars.cfm will be permissible for use in CKC tests.
Training or exercising of dogs is prohibited on the test grounds before, during, or after the test without the permission of the Field Test Chairman or the Field Test Secretary.
• Moving up - eligible dogs may move up to the next level, provided they inform the field test secretary one hour prior to the commencement of the test.

☐ Ribbons – Standard CKC qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all qualifying dogs. All ribbons are to be claimed at the Test – no ribbons will be mailed.
