CKC NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE: The CKC has a tracking fee for non-members. Please refer to the information about this policy on the CKC website:

If a dog is not registered individually in the records of the CKC, it may be entered at a trial held under these rules with a Temporary Competition Number (TCN), providing that the number is obtained before the closing date of entries. Once the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will no longer be valid. While there is no fee for the Temporary Competition Number, exhibitors will still be required to pay listing fees (\$10.50 including GST) when entering events. The request for a TCN will be self-serve; exhibitors should go to the CKC website to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly. Exhibitors may also obtain a TCN by completing a printed application and submitting it to the CKC, or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division by telephone.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND TEST RULES

CKC REGULATION: "It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Event Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred."

ELIGIBILITY

Purebred or mixed-breed dogs must be at least 6 months of age and:

- Are individually registered with the CKC (have a CKC registration number),
- Have an Event Registration Number (ERN),
- Have a Performance Event Number (PEN),
- Eligible for registration with the CKC and have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN)
- Have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed
- Have a Canine Companion number (CCN) if it is a mixed-breed

Dogs that are eligible for a CKC or ERN number but don't yet have one should have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). These can be obtained free of charge online from the CKC. For more information about the TCN:

*Note: TCN Fee of \$10.50 per dog, per show is payable with the entry fee if the entry form for the dog does not include the CKC Individual Registration Number. A service charge of 10% will be assessed for entries sent online, by fax or any entry using a credit card or Interac for payment.

ENTRY LIMIT: These Trials are limited. If the tests fill, waiting lists will be kept and dogs from the waiting list may be entered and added.

Handlers may only enter **1 dog in each component at each level.** Dogs can only be entered in Open through Masters if they have already obtained the preceding level title.

MOVE UPS: Same day trial move ups will not be allowed. Move ups for the next day's trial are allowed. Exhibitors must already be entered at the current level to move up. **Move ups for SUNDAY'S trial will be accepted at this event, BEFORE end of day SATURDAY & SUNDAY between 8:00am and 8:30am only if space is available.**

Judging schedules will be sent by email to exhibitors after the closing date

The owner of a dog entered in this show is entirely responsible for any errors in the entering of the dog, regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made. Please check your confirmations for accuracy.

RIBBONS & AWARDS:

Rosettes awarded for Instinct, Novice, Open, Excellent & Masters Titles

LEVELS OFFERED EACH DAY: Instinct, Novice, Open, Excellent & Masters

COMPONENTS OFFERED EACH DAY: CONTAINERS, INTERIOR, and EXTERIOR

ODOURS BEING TESTED:

Instinct & Novice	Wintergreen
Open	Wintergreen & Pine
Excellent	Wintergreen, Pine & Anise
Masters	Wintergreen, Pine, Anise & Clove

EQUIPMENT: The dog may wear a buckle, snap or martingale collar and/or body harness in the ring. Collars/harnesses with tags may be worn in the ring. Harnesses may have the leash attached to the front clip or on the back. Electronic training and pinch collars are not allowed on the grounds.

PENALTIES ISSUED BY THE CLUB: Dropping food while rewarding is considered contamination. Contamination of the search area, at the discretion of the Judge may result in a non-qualifying score. Any dog that urinates or defecates or vomits within the search area will be excused from the class and will result in a non-qualifying score.

SCENT DETECTION RULEBOOK: It is up to the individual handler to review the CKC Scent Detection Rulebook prior to the trial. Note: There were changes and updates made to the rulebook January 1, 2024.

REMINDER: That anyone discussing hides before the end of the trial will be excused and asked to leave as per CKC rules. Please show consideration for other competitors.

BITCHES IN SEASON: Bitches in season shall not be eligible to enter the test. If a bitch comes into season after entries have closed, the club will refund the entry fee providing the event secretary receives, on or before the event, a veterinarian's certificate declaring that the bitch was in season within the 7-day period preceding the trial.



CCN, ERN and PEN Numbers - The cost of obtaining a Canine Companion Number (CCN), Event Registration Number (ERN) or Performance Event Number (PEN) with the CKC has been increased to \$64.00 plus 5% GST Canadian funds.

REGULATIONS: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. BORDER CROSSING: A valid rabies certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada and it must be dated at least 30 days prior to entry into Canada. All participants should follow current Canadian health vaccine requirements and be prepared to provide vaccination documentation as required for entry into Canada. Unvaccinated participants will have done 14 days of quarantine immediately prior to trial date.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS:

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars.

SITE INFO:

There is limited parking. Please park in the designated marked area. Allow our committee to help you with a place to park. No special area will be designated for reactive dogs. These trials will be run rain or shine. All dogs must be under control, on a leash except during the trial where off leash searches are permitted. Flexi leads will not be allowed on the trial site. Please, clean up after yourself and your dog.

DIRECTIONS: On Hwy 3A between Nelson & Castlegar turn North onto BC 6 N (signs for Slocan/New Denver/Nakusp) at the Playmor Junction. Follow BC Hwy 6 to Slocan Park Hall (Approx. 11.8 KM) or to Crescent Valley Hall (Approx. 2.3 KM)

NO CONCESSION ON SITE: There is a COOP store with soup & sandwiches within walking distance of the Slocan Park Hall. Within walking distance to the Crescent Valley Hall is the Frog Peak restaurant or Crescent Valley Store. Or bring your own food, treats and water for you and your dog(s).

CANCELLATION OF EVENT: If the West Kootenay Kennel Club needs to cancel the event due to Provincial or Federal regulations, all entry fees will be returned.

ADDITIONAL TRIAL AND VENUE INFORMATION:

1. The club reserves the right to remove any person from the trial. The Event Chairperson shall have full control of the trial, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the chairperson or veterinarian for any reason, shall not, after being excused compete in any class for any award for the balance of the trial.
3. The Trial Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability for, either dogs, exhibitors or patrons in the event of an accident or misfortune.
4. The owner of a dog entered in these trials is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
5. If, because of civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the club, it is impossible to open or complete the trials, there is no refund of entry.
6. It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an obedience or rally trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Event Chairperson shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of the regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.
7. Schedules are based on 2 minutes per dog for Instinct, 9 minutes per dog for Novice and Open, 11 minutes per dog for Excellent, and 12 minutes per dog for Masters.
8. Please allow for absentees and variances in the rate of judging.
9. Please Obey ENTER and EXIT gates in the trial area.
10. No dogs and equipment shall not be left unattended at the trial venue.
11. Dogs must be on leash at all times inside the trial venue and trial grounds.
12. Exhibitors will be required to crate their dogs in their vehicle. Please be prepared for all types of weather. Recommend pop up tent, shade cloths, a portable fan, & ice water as October can still be hot in the Kootenays.
13. There will be NO spectators allowed inside trial venue.
14. Access to trial parking will be allowed on October 19 & 20 starting at 7:00 am. Please follow posted signage by trial venue and WKKC. Please Park neatly. Please adhere to Fire Lanes in all areas around the venue.
15. Ribbons and rosettes will be set out on a table. If you DO NOT want your ribbon or rosettes please leave it on the table, we will be happy to donate back to the club for you.
16. Exhibitors are expected to maintain a clean area. Please be considerate when utilizing any facilities. No dogs are permitted in the washrooms.
17. Bring your own food and drinks, for yourself and your dog.
18. No overnight recreational parking will be provided.
19. Exhibitors and Participants are expected to follow these event guidelines. Failure to comply may result in excusal from the remainder of this event. The club reserves the right to remove any person(s) from the show and the venue, which are governed by CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB (CKC) rules.

I (we) agree to hold the West Kootenay Kennel Club, the members, directors, officers, agents, superintendent, event secretary and the owners or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries including death at any time resulting there from, sustained by an person or persons, including myself, or on account of damage of property, arising out of or in consequence of my participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
