Conformation

Regular Classes Offered:

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered.

Junior Puppy Class-dogs -6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

Senior Puppy Class-dogs -9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12-18 Month Class-dogs -12months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

Canadian Bred -shall be for dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded.

Bred by Exhibitor-shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

Open Class: shall be for all dogs

Veteran: for all dogs over 7 years of age on the day of the show. These dogs will compete for regular placements and the winner of this class will go on to compete for Best of Breed. Dogs competing in the Veteran Class may be spayed/neutered.

Specials: This class shall be for any dog which has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status.

Award of Merit - At the discretion of the judge, 1 AOM may be awarded for every ten (10) dogs competing for Best of Breed.

Unofficial / Non-Regular Classes Offered:

Baby Puppy- dogs divided by sex, 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show

Exhibition only- dogs in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades if provided for in the premium list.

Juvenile Sweepstakes (All classes to be divided by sex)

4 to 6 months, 6 to 9 months, 9 to 12 months, 12 to 18 months.

Veteran Sweepstakes (All classes to be divided by sex)

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH NOVICE "A" & NOVICE "B" AT SAME TRIAL.

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH ADVANCED "A" & ADVANCED "B" AT SAME TRIAL

RALLY NOVICE A: Dogs competing in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice (R.N.) title or any CKC CDX Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, coowner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least

2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY NOVICE B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally

Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE: Is an elective Class.

RALLY ADVANCED A: This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R. N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY ADVANCED B: This class will be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT A: This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (R. E.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY EXCELLENT B: This class will be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on a leash.

RALLY MASTER: This class will be for dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class

Obedience Classifications

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH NOVICE "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH OPEN "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL

PRE-NOVICE – This class shall be for all purebred dogs and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous breeds and of either sex, which have not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs being entered in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. but must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together on the Group exercise. A dog may be entered in the Pre-Novice that has not earned the title of C.D. in Canada or a comparable title in any other country. The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

NOVICE "A" - This class is open to all dogs, providing the dog has not earned the title of "CD" in ANY COUNTRY. **One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor.** The exhibitor **MUST BE THE OWNER** or **A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY and MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES**. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its "CDX" title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class, but **MUST COMPETE IN NOVICE "B" CLASS**

NOVICE "B" - This class is open to all dogs, which have not earned the title of "CD", and may be shown by the owner or any other person. The dog may not necessarily be CKC or ERN Reg'd to compete in this class

NOVICE "C" – This class is open to any dog of either sex that has gained the title Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and the Long Down Exercises when they are judged in the same group. The Novice 'C' exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice Class except that exhibitors may compete in the Novice 'C' class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice 'C' Class are not eligible for High In Trial.

The P.C.D. and C.D.I. and Novice 'C' are elective classes which are offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience and acclimation to the trial situation or would like to earn additional titles. Dogs may be entered in the Novice – Intermediate (C.D.I.) and/or Novice 'C' class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial Classes.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE CLASS – This class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter the Open Class. This class shall be for any dog of any recognized breed or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or higher title. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High In Trial. Dogs are eligible to compete in this class indefinitely. Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

OPEN CLASSES There are four (4) Open classes: The Open HA and Open HB classes, which include the Out of Sight Group Stay Exercises and the Open 18A and Open 18B classes, which include the Change of Positions and Group Sit - Walk Around exercises.

OPEN "HA" & "18A- This class is open to all dogs which have earned the title of "CD" IN CANADA, but have not earned the title of "CDX" in any country. **One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor.** The exhibitor **MUST BE THE OWNER** or **A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY** and **MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES**. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its "UD" title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete. CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

OPEN "HB" & "18B"- This class is open to all dogs, which have earned the title of "CD" in CANADA, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. This dog **MAY ALSO COMPETE IN THE UTILITY CLASS**. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

UTILITY CLASS 'A' - This class is open to any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of "CDX" but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a M.O.T.Ch title may not handle dogs in this class..This dog must be shown by the owner or a member of their immediate families. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class. Owners may enter More than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score will be cancelled.

UTILITY CLASS 'B' - This class is open to any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of "CDX" or U.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will decide the order of exercises to be performed. This order will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ringside approx. 30 minutes prior to the start of the class.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted checks will not be accepted. Personal checks will be accepted, however, they are to be in Canadian funds. If you send a check in U.S. funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark checks "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks and would constitute non payment of funds.

To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase BANK DRAFTS or MONEY ORDERS payable in CANADIAN FUNDS. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

New as of March 2, 2020 Temporary Competition Numbers or (TCN)

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event and the same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a (Performance Event Number) PEN or (Canine Companion Number) CCN. While there is no fee to obtain a TCN, exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called listing fees) when entering events using this number. The process of obtaining a TCN will be self-serve; exhibitors will be directed to the CKC website to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly upon completion. Exhibitors may also obtain a TCN by completing a printed application and submitting it to the CKC via mail, or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division by telephone. Before you apply for a TCN Dogs on the Owner's Portal account. Please note that if your dog does not have a registration number or ERN, and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores, or awards, there is no need to apply for a TCN. CKC records will be updated accordingly.

Notice to All Canadian Residents Only

Section 24-12-3.

Non-member participation fee

A) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC

B) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the nonmember participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER (ERN) : Effective Jan. 1, 1992, all foreign born and foreign owned dogs that enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration #, but will require an EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER (ERN). The ERN number must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Forms to apply for an ERN will be available at the show. Or simply send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate reflecting current ownership, with a written request for an ERN number and a check for \$58.85 payable to the Canadian Kennel Club, Shows and Trials, 200 Ronson Dr., Suite 400, Etobicoke, Ontario. M9W 5Z9

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

<u>SECTION 1</u> – A dog awarded *Winners* at a championship show held under the Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be accredited to a dog awarded Winners shall be provided hereunder.

<u>SECTION 2</u> – The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded. *Winners* shall be as follows.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused, or ordered from the ring by the judge **shall not** be included in the calculation for championship points.

The new system provides for additional points if a dog awarded Winners also places in the GROUP as listed below.

A class dog awarded **Best in Show** at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In **no** case may a dog earn more than **five (5)** points at a **single show**. In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 different judges; and (b) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number. (c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level. (15.1.13).

<u>Best Puppy in Breed</u> – Where a dog awarded Best of Breed is not a puppy, those puppies which have not been defeated either directly or indirectly by another puppy in the breed will compete for this award. Judging follows the award for Best of Breed. A puppy awarded Best Puppy in Breed, is <u>NOT</u> required to stay to compete for Best Puppy in Group (15.3.1f)

Grand Champion (GCh) The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

(c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website. To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special: (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins. (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles, (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each.

Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career. NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above. 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honored up until July 1, 2022.

MOVING CLASS DOGS TO SPECIALS

A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or has an ERN number at the time of closing of entries, and has completed the requirements for a championship in accordance with the provisions of **Chapter 20** of the **Dog Show Rules**, after the closing date and time for entries for a show, but whose championship is yet unconfirmed by the CKC may be transferred from one of the regular classes to "Specials Only" providing the transfer is submitted to the show secretary in writing **at least one (1) hour prior to the opening of the show**, by the owner or handler.

Effective January 1994: If your dog has the required number of Championship points and you do not have your registration number before entries close, and you receive your registration **BEFORE** the date of the show, you may move your dog up to Specials if you provide the Show Secretary with the registration number and the dog has been entered in the classes as a **LISTED** dog. Listing fees, however, **WILL NOT be refunded**.

An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Rule (8.2.5)

EXHIBITORS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR DOG SHOWS AND OBEDIENCE TRALS. BOOKLETS ON DOG SHOW AND OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE C.K.C.

Due to limited grooming space **NO private x-pens** will be allowed.
