CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

NOVICE DRAFT DOG TESTS

Control Exercises - demonstrates the dog's ability to be a safe and obedient companion and worker. Two basic exercises will be performed: 1) Heel On Lead, 2) Group Down Stay for 1 Minute.

Carting Exercises - demonstrates the dog's usefulness as a draft animal in maneuvering loads safely and quietly on a wheeled vehicle over a moderate distance and smooth terrain. Four basic areas are covered: 4) Harness & Hitching, 5) Maneuvers, 6) Figure Eight, 7) Backup (.61m / 2 ft).

Field Work Exercises - demonstrates the dog's ability to pull a suitable freight load (approximately 18.2 kg / 40 lbs over a moderate distance in cooperation with the handler. Three basic areas are covered 8) Hitching & Loading, 9) Hauling, 10) Unloading & Unhitching.

DRAFT DOG & BRACE DRAFT DOG TESTS

Control Exercises - demonstrates the dog's ability to be a safe and obedient companion and worker. Two basic exercises will be performed: 1) Heel Off Lead, 2) Group Down Stay for 3 Minutes.

Carting Exercises - demonstrates the dog's usefulness as a draft animal in maneuvering loads safely and quietly on a wheeled vehicle over a moderate distance and smooth terrain. Four basic areas are covered: 4) Harness & Hitching, 5) Stand, Stay, retrieve Object, 6) Maneuvers, 7) Figure Eight, 8) Backup (1.2m / 4 ft).

Field Work Exercises - demonstrates the dog's ability to pull a suitable freight load (approximately 18.2 kg / 40 lbs for DD and 36kg/80lbs for BDD) over a moderate distance in cooperation with the handler. Three basic areas are covered 8) Hitching & Loading, 9) Hauling, 10) Unloading & Unhitching.

DRAFT DOG EXCELLENT & BRACE DRAFT DOG EXCELLENT TESTS

Carting Exercises - demonstrates the dog's competence as a draft animal in pulling a wheeled vehicle on a smooth surface. All exercises will include a load (approximately 27.2 kg / 60 lbs for DDX and 54 kg/120 lbs for BDDX) set by the Test Chairperson. The areas covered are: 1) Harnessing/ Hitching/ Loading, 2) Backup (1.2m / 4 ft), 3) Maneuvers (handler beside cart), 4) Maneuvers (handler behind cart).

Freight Haul Exercises - demonstrates the dog's usefulness as a reliable freighting companion and worker. The areas covered are: 5) Harnessing/Hitching/Loading, 6) Hauling (18.2 kg to 27.2 kg / 40 to 60 lbs for DDX and 36-54kg / 80 - 120lbs for BDDX), 7) Unloading & Unhitching.

Backpacking Exercises - demonstrates the ability of the dog to function as a pack animal, carrying a load over a long distance and rough terrain. The areas covered are: 8) Loading, 9) Packing (at 1/6 the dog's weight to a maximum of 11.3 kg / 25 lbs), 10) Distraction, 11) Unloading. Note: in the case of Brace teams, the pack may be put on the dog already loaded. The handler may place one dog in a comfortable position (sit, down or stand are acceptable) while packing the second dog.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Events Registration Number (ERN). To obtain an ERN number simply do the following:

1. Send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate reflecting current ownership, for example AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN number.
2. Include with the above a cheque or money order in the amount currently required payable to the Canadian Kennel Club.
3. Ensure that you provide us with your full return address to enable the ERN number to be sent to you.
4. Faxed requests will be accepted. Please indicate your Visa/MasterCard number expiry date, cardholders name and signature.

This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as "LISTED", however, failure to apply for an ERN number within 30 days will result in cancellation of any wins, awards or scores.
